

A is for Arab: Stereotypes in U.S. Popular Culture -- A traveling exhibition presented by the Asian/Pacific/American Institute and the Hagop Kevorkian Center for Near Eastern Studies at New York University



Dimensions: The exhibition is comprised of 8, double-sided, HopUp panels, each measuring 89.5" H x 30.75" W x 12" D. The bases of the stands are each 29" D" deep, and panels are affixed into the bases. With all panels positioned side by side, the exhibition measures a total of 21' in length, and for ideal viewing, should have a clearance of 12' on each side. To accommodate smaller spaces, several alternative arrangements are possible; and, if only one side of the exhibition is able to be displayed, the back (black) side of the exhibition can face a wall.
