

Hawai'i is not the United States, but it is your Future

An Installation by Sean Connelly | Artist-in-Residence, Asian | Pacific | American Institute at NYU

Exhibition Abstract:

Hawai'i is not the United States, but it is your Future, an exhibition by artist and building practitioner Sean Connelly, foregrounds oceanic ways of knowing in a continental setting. Advancing an understanding of the built environment as an interdependent system of body, land, water, and sky, the exhibition asks how urban and ecological futures might unfold when built environments are conceived as islands—navigated, sustained, and repaired through reciprocal collaboration. Through sculptural and cartographic works, Connelly invites audiences to reconsider urban conditions through Oceanic frameworks that nurture continuity rather than fragmentation. Embedded within a community that has long advocated for Hawai'i history amid complex ties to places like New York and the continental United States, the exhibition convenes a transoceanic conversation grounded in place-based perspectives and remains mindful not to eclipse the Indigenous contexts of peoples working in solidarity to recover their histories and places.

Presented at 20 Cooper Square Gallery on Lenape lands occupied by the United States, the exhibition centers Hawai'i history and Oceanic perspectives while taking care not to overwrite the diverse local and Indigenous histories of New York and the East Coast; instead, it situates itself in humble dialogue with ongoing, often overlooked struggles against dispossession, forced removal, and erasure, and with the continuing efforts of Lenape peoples—whose expansive homelands include New York City—to pursue return and sovereignty in parallel with Native communities across Turtle Island, Hawai'i, and the Pacific.

Over the past fifteen years, Connelly's practice has pursued the advancement of 'āina (land/that which feeds) through the recovery of ahupua'a, land divisions extending mauka to makai (mountain to ocean), as both method and metaphor for remapping social and environmental balance. His early project *Hawai'i Futures* (2010) advanced an ocean–earth–island–cosmos framework for living in place, reframing the ahupua'a as an interconnected system of water, soil, wind, and people oriented toward sustenance and regeneration. Engaging digital mapping and contemporary fabrication with ancestral modes of making, governance, and reciprocity, his work moves between speculation and application, ranging from earthen monoliths and thatched, lashed assemblies to videographic studies of navigation and electromagnetic waveforms, as well as community-led efforts to restore 'āina across the Pae 'Āina o Hawai'i (Hawaiian Islands).

Born and raised in Hawai'i within the plantation-era Ilokano diaspora and a queer, matriarchal, multiethnic 'ohana shaped by Kanaka 'Ōiwi (Native Hawaiian) relatives, Connelly's perspectives are grounded in his history as an Ilokano Pacific Islander American and in demonstration of the relationships, teachings, and cultural resurgence that have guided his family and community. While he claims his heritage as Ilokano and not Native Hawaiian, his own cultural reclamation within the wider Oceanic diaspora has been shaped by place-based solidarity with the cultural commitments of his Kanaka 'Ōiwi family and community, including younger generations raised speaking 'Ōlelo Hawai'i (Hawaiian) as a first language. His work emerges from Indigenous, diasporic, and multiethnic family relations without making claims to identity, but rather foregrounding his commitments to place, Indigeneity, and oceanic futures within the lived cultural context of his 'ohana and community.

Artist's Statement:

On the window a message in gold catches the light: *Hawai'i is not the United States, but it is your Future*. Behind it, a sixteen-foot outrigger canoe named Kanāho rests low in a deliberate posture, its seats carrying wooden forms intricately fastened with aho cord and notches alone, designed and lashed by the artist without glue or metal. Along the walls, a veiled map gently reorients the East Coast to face the viewer mauka to makai (mountain to ocean), echoing Hawai'i ways of perceiving place. Together, the exhibition reads as an indoor public artwork, scaled for the street, and is anchored by the poetic saying, *he wa'a he moku, he moku he wa'a—the canoe is an island, the island a canoe*. The proverb names the reciprocity of life in finite space: to live on an island, as to travel by canoe, is to depend on others, to move together, and to keep balance through attention and care. Canoe and island alike become studies in provisioning, cooperation, and governance. This meeting of message, vessel, and geography offers ways to observe, to act, and to be human in place—with the past carrying the present into the future.

Greeting the city with tenderness and accountability, the gold inscription of the exhibition title recalls Hawaiian-style heirloom bracelets engraved with names and genealogies, gifts of affection and continuity, often passed down to family, friends and loved ones. According to my mentor Trisha Lagasso Goldberg, the bracelet owes its popularity in Hawai'i to Queen Lili 'uokalani who received her first golden bracelet in 1887 at Queen Victoria's Jubilee in London. The bracelet bore the phrase "Hoomanao Mau (Always Remember)". For me, the bracelet reminds me of the people who hold our communities together, the sound of bracelets like chimes singing the movements and love of our aunties, uncles, and mentors who hold our communities together.

Now here facing the streets of New York City, in the homelands of Lenape people, the bracelet is presented as a gift to cities and onward to always remember, "Hawai'i is not the United States, but it is your Future." Offering the intimacy of an heirloom and the clarity of a declaration, the phrase both refuses and offers: *Not the United States*, a reminder of obscured histories and enduring sovereignties. *But it is your Future*, a call for liberation of islands, continents, seas, and sky. Doubling as the title of the exhibition, the work suggests that conditions long visible in Hawai'i—precarity, militarization, import dependence, and cultural resurgence—are not anomalies, but forecasts. Hawai'i is not a paradise, nor a periphery, but a precedent.

As Haunani-Kay Trask reminds us, struggle is political; it must operate at every scale of occupation, local, state, and federal. The title *Hawai'i is not the United States, but it is your Future* calls on people across the continental United States to deepen awareness of Hawai'i and Pacific histories. It invites learning, witnessing, and following precedent from Hawai'i's knowledge and experience around its continuing struggle and ongoing resurgence. It also calls back to Hawai'i to consider responsibilities to sovereignty and return, and to the liberation, healing, and survivance of peoples across Turtle Island. In New York, across Lenapehoking, this means sustained attention and solidarity from Hawai'i in affirming and supporting Lenape return to Lenapehoking and the re-activation and everyday exercise of inherent sovereignty. That includes land access, governance, language revival, and cultural stewardship, since these conditions make liberation, healing, and cultural continuance possible in the first place.

The exhibition title also reflects my own learning as an artist living between Hawai'i and the continent over time. It recognizes the struggle and occupation of Hawai'i by the United States and acknowledges the evolving privilege held by many in Hawai'i, and in the diaspora, who stand on the platforms built by artists, scholars, and cultural practitioners of the 1960s - 1990s. It asks the people of Hawai'i to sustain awareness and extend advocacy not just for Hawai'i, but for other Native, diasporic, displaced, and marginalized communities across the United States working toward self-determination and liberation. We must ensure that the learning and advancement toward aspired futures occurring in Hawai'i can extend across continents. Neither Hawai'i nor the United States are monoliths. We can ask how Hawai'i's long arc of resurgence can be in relation with Lenape and other Indigenous communities committed to the return and re-activation of inherent sovereign authority of Indigenous knowledge and ecologies. How might the mutual liberation of Hawai'i and Turtle Island, grounded in truth-telling, good relationship, and return to place, help shape shared futures for Indigenous, diasporic, and Asian/Pacific/American communities committed to justice, continuance, and self-determination?

He Wa'a (The Canoe - Kanāho)

At the center of the gallery rests a sixteen-foot three-person outrigger canoe (wa'a) built on Hawai'i Island from wood and fiberglass. Across Oceania and beyond, canoes have carried people, food, and material culture for millennia; they also carry resurgence. The contemporary revival of double-hull voyaging and wayfinding—from Micronesia through Hawai'i, and as far as Taiwan and the Philippines—has reanimated knowledge thought nearly lost. To place a small wa'a here in Manahatta (likely the only one of its kind in the city) is to say that survival, whether at sea or in a metropolis, relies on shared ethics: prepare together, paddle together, remember together, forgive together, resurge together. *He moku he wa'a, he wa'a he moku*—the island is a canoe; the canoe an island.

Without humans the canoe is not a canoe. For this sculpture I placed, in each seat, a wooden object I designed, notched, and lashed with cordage only—no glue or metal. The 'aho (lashings) record a choreography of making—looping, binding, pausing—that echoes the steadiness of hula, the heartbeat of paddling, and breath over distance. Built from North American hardwoods—cherry, walnut, maple, and oak—the pieces were sourced in the Bronx, milled in Brooklyn, and assembled in Manahatta; the wa'a came via Hoboken and will return there. This circulation of making across Lenapehoking resists modernist sameness and makes production a way of connecting islands, where making is remembering. These bodies-as-structures stand in for the paddlers and mirror their roles: seat one sets the pace, seat two calls the changes, seat three steers.

Seat One, Pace; Structure, Cubes / Ahu / Pā

In the first seat, a gridded assembly of cubes references the repetition and stacking of a stone ahu (altar) or pā (wall). An ahu typically marks the boundary of an ahupua'a, while the pā anchors platforms and walls that form the foundations of everything from buildings to farm systems (as in lo'i, wetland terraces, and loko i'a, fishponds) to observation and spiritual systems (as in heiau, shrines). Ahu means "to heap": stacking as technology, ceremony, and law in stone. Pā, a word for wall, implies making the fleeting or intangible, tangible. Each cube is bound with the 'ilio lashing—named for the bite of a dog—whose repeated loops draw separate parts into one hold; each lashing varying. The wood is carved to assist in the steady pacing and repetition of the lashing.

Seat Two, Rhythm; Structure, Spiral / Hei

In the second seat, the tallest object—a spiraling helix—references the hei, or net, which means to ensnare, and marks ascent and ceremony. The simple yet ornamented carved profile of the wood in walnut pays tribute to the type of refined woodwork found in ceremonial objects placed upon heiaus (ceremonial sites) and 'Iolani Palace. In a canoe, seat two calls side-switches of the paddlers who alternate in stroke, half left, half right. Without switching, the arms of the paddlers become tired. Therefore seat two is responsible for the syncing of blades, bodies, and lungs. The helix gives that voice structure: motion into order, and the discipline required for well-timed, collective rhythm that carries the canoe farther than force alone.

Last Seat, Direction; Structure, Hale Wa'a / "auwana"

The last seat of the outrigger canoe, whether a three-seat, four-seat, or six-seat, is responsible for steering direction. Here, I placed a structure that references the component of a Hale Wa'a (Canoe House), highlighting the rafters and double ridgepole. I nicknamed this structure 'auwana, which means to wander, in reference to the inspiration of contemporary Hula 'Auana which is more fluid than the traditional Hula Kahiko. Here the 'auwana of the design (utilizing a different variation of the word as not to be confused with its use in hula) is referenced for its fluidity and wander across history and time, where the components of the hale wa'a at the scale of this sculpture is held together with aho (lashing) typically used for joining the outrigger to the canoe. This proposes steering as relation and hybridization.

Outside the Canoe; Structure, Spears / Tensegrity

Outside the canoe, a fourth wooden study holds three "spears" in a tensegrity structure—standing separately yet interdependent—kept in suspension by tension rather than interlocking joints or compression. In dialogue with the seat objects, it extends the human presence that sends off and receives a canoe. Around the gallery, modular "building blocks" recall Hawai'i's familiar cinder blocks, reinterpreted as small mo'o (lizard / water spirit) like geometries reminding us the built world is held by story as much as by standards.

Kanāho — Canoe Naming and Significance

This wa'a is named Kanāho, a word describing relief after struggle: joy over escape, rest after exertion, refuge, guided in usage by linguist Ha'alilio Solomon. The name gestures toward what one might seek through ho'oponopono, the Native Hawaiian practice of restoring right relations through ritualized communication that begins with forgiveness of the other and of oneself, shaped for me by mentors like Manulani Aluli Meyer and Prentis Hemphill. Here, resolution is not closure but continual repair that begins with oneself. The saying he wa'a he moku, he moku he wa'a is also logistics and governance, an island preparing for a voyage through cultivation, preservation, repair, and practiced roles. Even this smaller outrigger canoe, often for fishing or recreation, points to that continuum. In this spirit, Kanāho is dedicated as a platform of healing and becoming, a wahi kanāho—place of refuge—invoking apology, forgiveness, accountability, and the work of making what has been wrong, right. This name animates the canoe as a living vessel carrying histories of labor, hurt, and repair across distance, from Honolulu to New York, from Hawai'i to Turtle Island, from ocean memory to urban present.

He Moku (The Island – Wall Map)

Wrapping the gallery, a wall map reorients the East Coast from Georgia to Maine through a Hawai'i lens—applying the concept of a moku (island) mauka to makai, mountain to ocean. May this vantage point from the waters be in good relation across place and time to Lenape peoples who also often view their homelands from the vantage point of the waters. In 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, moku names a systems order of living in which water, wind, soils, and community flow together. Within a moku, land divisions called ahupua'a organize systems of cultivation and care so that resources and responsibility circulate rather than fragment space and time. When mapping 'āina in Hawai'i, the following six families of layers that are important to consider, are presented here in the wall graphic for the East Coast to simulate an applied Hawai'i perspective —(1) Topography, (2) Waters, (3) Ecoregions, (4) Native/Indigenous Territories, (5) Urban Areas, (6) US Militarization / Occupation. Referenced here in this particular map are 130 streams · 16 ecoregions · 170 Indigenous territories · 11 federally recognized reservations · 8 off-reservation trust lands · 461 urban areas · 182 military reservations · 432 formerly used defense sites (See Appendix for full metadata included in the map).

1) Base topography: Changing the north-south viewpoint to mauka-makai (mountain-to-ocean) reframes the coast as an environmental system, not an imperial grid. I amplify the vertical topography 30 times because, at standard scale, the mountains appear flat. This graphic amplification emphasizes the mountain-to-ocean cycle crucial to ahupua'a resource logic. I use this scale tactic transparently and cautiously, unlike colonial drawings that exaggerated heights to exoticize Hawai'i. My disciplined use of scale serves to reveal the large environmental cycle and heighten the perception of detail moving across varied terrain.

2) Waters: Major rivers and shorelines are shown at primary stream orders to remain legible at architectural scale. In Hawai'i, the vantage of mauka to makai primarily follows the flow of resources like water, which also moves and sorts soil and other resources across sky to land, mountain, stream, and ocean, an act of remembering how water organizes observation of governance, cultivation, sustenance, and ceremony.

3) Ecoregions: In Hawai'i, land division and the recovery of 'āina traverse multiple ecological zones, shaping soils, climate, and vegetation, which are vital for Native food systems and resources. The recovery of 'āina requires governance that sustains these lifeways. Aligning care with ecoregions treats agriculture, gathering, and building as place-specific obligations, unlike American planning, which often ignores these ecological continuities. This layer insists care follows ecology, not administrative boundaries, guiding the practices that sustain a place by the regions and the people with ecological knowledge.

4) Native / Indigenous Territories: This layer brings together publicly available datasets on Indigenous Territories, federally recognized American Indian reservations, and Off-Reservation Trust Lands. Paralleling mapping practices that see land from the perspective of Hawai'i History, the representation centers persistence, relation, and governance. Boundaries of territories are drawn as double lines, similar to lines that depict wind or current, to register motion, reverberation of language, and the ripples of resurgence, rejecting the fiction of a single fixed edge. These lines do not adjudicate claims or settle disputes. They are incomplete, as they fail to acknowledge the continued connection to homelands of Lenape who were

ethnically cleansed and removed ultimately to Oklahoma, Wisconsin, and southern Ontario. In their presence and absence, the lines mark ongoing survivance and resurgence and remain open to correction by the communities they name. Sources and links for each dataset appear in the appendix to support review, updates, and accountability.

5) Urban Areas: Census-defined urban areas map the contemporary concentration of population, infrastructure, and institutions, foregrounding the city as a site of knowledge production while holding it in tension with the rural landscapes that sustain it. We pair these footprints with the rail grid of 1870 to read present settlement against the network that accelerated settler expansion and industrial extraction. The 1870 layer also references King Kalākaua's rail journey across the United States that year, marking a trans-Pacific moment of diplomatic encounter and the consolidation of a settler economy built on steel, coal, and motion.

6) US Militarization / Occupation: Active military reservations and Formerly Used Defense Sites map a continuing geography of occupation; in Hawai'i they are places that often still require access controls and cleanup of unexploded ordnance, fuels, and heavy metals that persist in soil, groundwater, and memory. Additionally, a layer for State capitals and state boundaries provide the administrative framework within which this militarized geography is organized; placing American Indian reservations and military reservations in the same field does not equate them but contrasts intensity and visibility, distinguishing what is heavily resourced and secured from what is administratively bounded and historically constrained.

Ke Ulu Ale'ale'a, May Joy Grow In The Process

Taken together, the works form an environment for practicing relations—between Hawai'i and the continental United States, between islands and continents, between histories of struggle and possibilities of return. The gestures of lashing, mapping, and engraving extend an ethic of interdependence that begins with attention and continues through care. The exhibition title, *Hawai'i is not the United States, but it is your Future*, names this tension and its potential: a place where the effects of occupation, militarization, and resurgence are lived in daily proximity, and where the work of liberation is continuous. The exhibition invites reflection on how these same forces shape the continent, asking what might be learned from Hawai'i's long arc of resurgence and how its commitments to restoration and living sovereignty can inform the mutual healing of lands and peoples across Turtle Island. It positions the Pacific Ocean not at the edge but at its center, as a teacher of endurance and transformation, where living within limits becomes an art of abundance and shared relation. Across the connected geographies of Oceania, the work extends a mutual responsibility: for those in the continental United States to learn from Hawai'i and Pacific histories, and for those in Hawai'i to sustain solidarity with other Indigenous and marginalized communities seeking acknowledgement and liberation. In the rhythm of lashing, paddling, and mapping, the exhibition proposes a practice of action—one that joins healing with accountability, and remembrance with forward motion. Together, these collaborative relations offer the horizon as a shared ocean from where struggle is not merely endured but transformed, where sovereignty and solidarity move in rhythm, and where joy is proof of life continuing through repair. As Manulani Meyer reminds us at the end of *Holographic Epistimologies*, Ke ulu ale'ale'a, may joy grow in the process!

Played On Loop

Untitled Moku Map 1, Aligned (2025, 1 min)

Hawai'i-Pangea Antipode (2016, 4 min)

In this silent videographic map, the artist reimagines scale and planetary relation by tracing a line from Hawai'i through the Earth's core to its antipode in the Kalahari Desert. The shifting image moves between the forms of tectonic plates, a human skull, and faces in conversation—suggesting that geography and the body mirror one another.

Lava Lobster (2014, 3 min)

"GEOLOGY MOVES FASTER THAN WE THINK." The closing statement of *Lava, Lobster* is an energetic reminder of the speed at which change, across very different scales, unfolds. Two time-stamped videos—a lobster molting and a seafloor lava flow erupting—are drawn together, progressing side-by-side. For a brief moment, over the course of two minutes and twenty four seconds, the life of a marine crustacean and the formation of new earth merge onto a single timeline. *Lava, Lobster* is a glimpse into Connelly's larger practice committed to thinking deeply about large-scale infrastructural challenges that coming generations are bound to face in order to offer viable pathways and practices to advance more just futures for Hawai'i and the world. In the face of planetary crisis, let us not forget that radical transformations move faster than we think. (Text description edited by kekahi wahi)

HOTSPOT (2016, 5m)

HOTSPOT is a geological sound bath—a journey through a tomographic interpretation of the volcanic hotspot at the dynamic genesis of the Hawaiian Islands. Moving from the Earth's core to its surface, the film passes through layers of visualized and sonified data. Emerging transformed, Connelly reinterprets deep childhood memories calling on mapping techniques, architectural modeling, alimentary canals, planetary systems, and spirit. Untitled Moku Map 2, Rotation (2025, 1 min)

Oahu is a Giant Military Base (2021, 4 min)

O'ahu is a Giant Military Base (OAGMB), an exercise in experimental cartography, is part of a larger project by Connelly and their accomplices to interrupt U.S. Urbanism and the ongoing militarization of 'āina. Set to a slowed version of beloved musician Israel Kamakawiwo'ole's cover of "Somewhere Over the Rainbow," OAGMB functions as a counter music video, making visible U.S. military presence on O'ahu from 1898 to present. A perspective view of the island reveals fences, forts, bunkers, bases, live-fire ranges, underground fuel storage facilities, evidence of long-standing desecration—"Dreams really do come true-oooh-oooh." Pōhakuloa (2024, 3 min)

This mock karaoke video collages archival military testing footage and found newsreels from Kaho'olawe and Pohakuloa, set to the song "Pōhakuloa" by Gary K. Haleamau. The mock karaoke video provides new meaning and insight on the song about the gentle and peaceful place, Pohakuloa, which today is currently occupied and bombed by the United States Military as the Pohakuloa Training Area. As the video goes in support of movements to demilitarize Pōhakuloa, dd'Nanea ise malie. Relax and be at ease.

Technology of Ahupua'a in the Production of Food and Surfing (2019, 5m)

This video transports viewers to a future architecture seminar taught exclusively in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, a moment yet to come as of 2024. The video dips into a digital architectural landscape model of an ahupua'a, visualized with real-world geospatial datasets measuring monthly rainfall, wind power, soil permeability, and nutrient capacity. The mapping is animated to the evocative sounds of water phase changes from liquid to ice, interwoven with the archival melody of the 'ō'ō bird chirping in the forest, before its extinction, declaring a sensory perspective that reveres the place and temporal presence of akua, as the backdrop of various selections of architectural design theory from Sanford Kwinter, to Mary Kawena Pukui, to Samuel Kamakau selected specifically by the artist.

Played Upon Request

O'ahu Military Atlas: Community Presentation (2019 - 2021, 20 min)

This short film surveys O'ahu's military landscape through ten areas: land use, facilities, airspace, training grounds, water systems, Red Hill, ammunition storage, dumpsites, intelligence networks, and nuclear testing. It previews the O'ahu Military Atlas, a 3D spatial analysis created by Sean Connelly between 2014 and 2020 at Harvard, NTU, and UH Mānoa. Built from archival U.S. military maps, territorial surveys, environmental reports, and community testimony gathered by Native Hawaiian, Local, and Settler student researchers, the project visualizes how military operations since the 1898 annexation have reshaped the island's geography. The film omits cultural detail to focus on the spatial and infrastructural logics of militarization and is presented strictly "as is," without warranty of accuracy or completeness.

Gut Technics / Hydraulic Islands (2014-2024, 30 min)

Hydraulic Islands is an experimental short film by Sean Connelly examining the technological history of the Pacific Ocean, linking imperialism and environmental harm. Using digital cartography, field recordings, and archival imagery, the film traces the evolution of navigation systems—from early radio to GPS—showing how these tools of exploration and defense have observed and accelerated ecological collapse. Connelly frames this inquiry with the Hawaiian concept of Gut Technics, an embodied intelligence connecting human and oceanic systems, proposing a shift from militarized extraction to relational care. The work argues that every GPS user is tied to Hawai'i's legacy, demanding an ethical confrontation and envisioning a technological future focused on justice, reconciliation, and planetary healing.

Exhibition Program

Connelly's first solo presentation in New York City follows related presentations at ii Gallery, Koa Gallery, and the Honolulu Museum of Art on O'ahu, Hawai'i, and more recently at the Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum and the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. The exhibition is accompanied by public programs on May 2, November 13, and December 3, 2025, all generously co-sponsored by the NYU Center for Collaborative Indigenous Research with Communities and Lands.

About the Artist

An artist and building practitioner from Hawai'i, Sean Connelly, advances Native liberation in place through collaborative and projective work across sculpture, architecture, film, and cartography. Working with cultural bearers, creative practitioners, and Indigenous scholars across Pae 'Āina Hawai'i (the Hawaiian Islands), Connelly helps transform built environments into living archives that sustain food sovereignty, land justice, and cultural resurgence, building a grassroots community of care and shaping liberated oceanic futures.

As founding director of After Oceanic and the nonprofit Hawai'i Nonlinear, Connelly centers 'āina (land, that which feeds). Through art, architecture, and activism, these initiatives cultivate ancestral knowledge and ecological insight toward intergenerational healing, well-being, and belonging.

Born and raised in Honolulu and based in Honolulu (Kona, O'ahu), Connelly is embedded within a community of artists, scholars, and practitioners at the forefront of cultural and ecological resurgence in Hawai'i. Connelly has designed and taught courses at Harvard University, the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, Columbia University, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Connelly's work has received fellowships, grants, and residencies, and has been presented in galleries, museums, and institutions nationally and internationally. Notable affiliations include the Asian/Pacific/American Institute at NYU, Mellon Foundation, The MET, Cooper Hewitt Smithsonian Design Museum, Museum of Modern Art, Sundance Institute, W. S. Merwin Conservancy, Kunsthall Charlottenborg, NTU Centre for Contemporary Art Singapore, Santa Fe Art Institute, Honolulu Museum of Art, and Pu'uhonua Society.

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Artist's Acknowledgements

I am honored to join the Asian/Pacific/American Institute at NYU as Artist-in-Residence, building on my work that engages Pacific Islander American perspectives within the evolving cultural currents of contemporary urban life in Hawai'i and the United States. Born, raised, and growing up in Honolulu, I've developed an alternative art and architecture practice shaped by oceanic connections, intergenerational family histories, and the complex dynamics that emerge where grassroots activism meets global change. My artistic and activist-driven design approach weaves sculpture, architecture, film, and cartography together to examine spatial justice, food sovereignty, and our collective responsibilities to 'āina—the built environments that feed us. During this residency, I look forward to sharing my ongoing inquiries with NYU's diverse student body, faculty, and broader communities. I hope to foster conversations that spark fresh thinking about place, identity, and our entanglements in Hawai'i and across Oceania. I am thankful for this opportunity to expand upon new work about how Hawai'i and Oceanic perspectives might encourage us to rethink the history and future of how we imagine, care for, and shape our environment.

This exhibition was made possible through the generosity and dedication of many hands and hearts. About Ke Aloha Outrigger

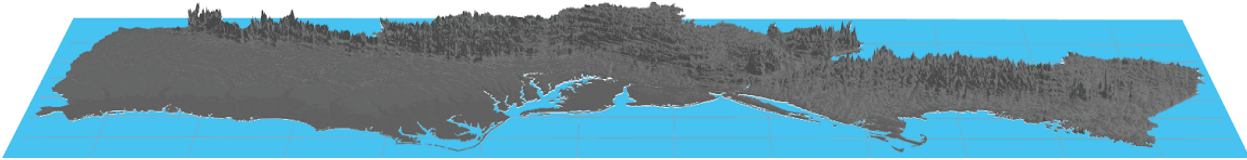

About Hawai'i Nonlinear

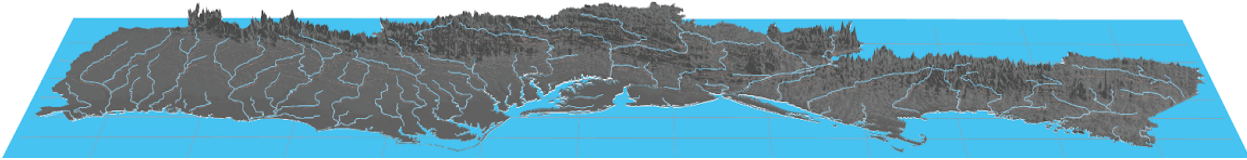

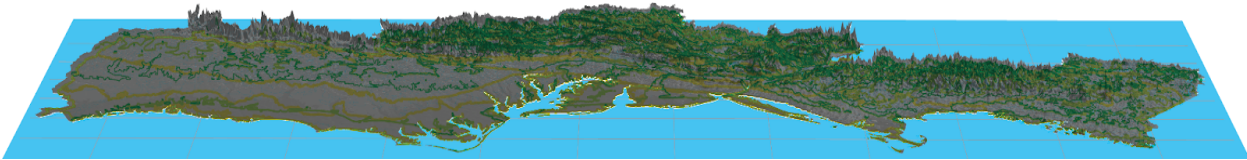

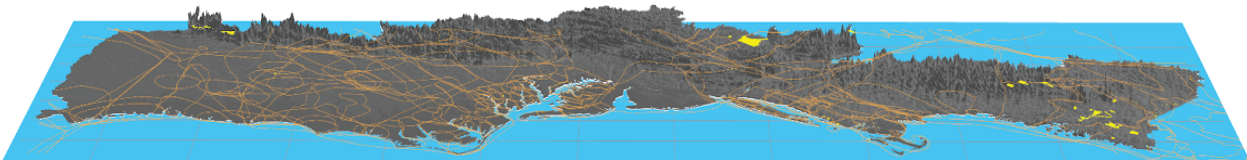

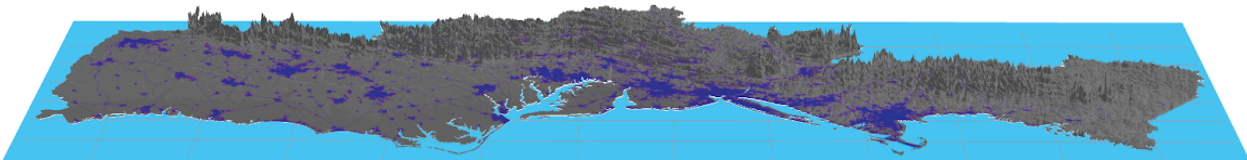

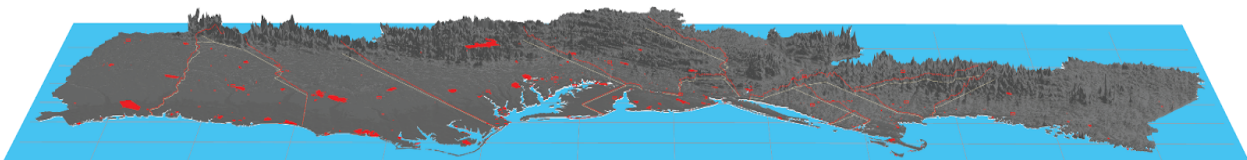
